Coordinates health education activities and community outreach under the direction of the Education and Community Engagement Division Director or designee. The primary responsibilities include but are not limited to:

- Assist in identifying and reach target population, geographic areas, venues/settings and peak times in the targeted areas that are at high risk for transmission of HIV, STIs and viral hepatitis.
- · Develop educational materials specific to the target population that are culturally sensitive and linguistically appropriate.

- Coordinate and facilitate focus groups to better understand the needs of the community.

Collaborates with division staff to provide disease prevention, including but not limited to HIV, HCV, and sexually transmitted diseases, and provides health education to clients, in homes, schools and community-based settings.

May supervise employees.

Performs other duties as required.
